



# VINE TRAIL ST. HELENA TO CALISTOGA

## About The Vine Trail

The Napa Valley Vine Trail is a planned 47-mile regional multi-use path connecting six cities - Vallejo, American Canyon, Napa, Yountville, St. Helena and Calistoga. It is the centerpiece of the bikeway and pedestrian system offering residents and visitors an alternative way to get around Napa Valley. The trail's alignment generally follows the State Route 29 corridor.

The proposed 8-mile Class 1 multi-use trail encompasses the northern segment of the Napa Valley Vine Trail connecting the cities of St. Helena and Calistoga. The route parallels SR 29 and connects to Bothe Napa Valley State Park.

Residents and workers can access the trail along with the 1.6 million visitors who patronize the more than 100 wineries, restaurants, resorts and spas in the area. Students attending the Culinary Institute of America and the St. Helena Napa Valley College campus also can utilize the pathway. This project is essential to the economic well-being of the area and for reducing motorized traffic on SR 29 and Silverado Trail by providing a safe alternative for those using active transportation, such as biking or walking.
